



TAN SIOW AIK (b. 1948) began to study Chinese ink painting with master artist Fan Chang Tien in 1963. In these early years, wide-ranging themes sumptuously depicted in traditional ink painting – flowers, plants, birds, fishes, shrimps, stones and bamboos – characterised Tan's works. Tan then shifted his attention to bamboo painting – an enduring genre in traditional ink painting which makes stringent demands on the practitioner: discipline, clarity, articulate brushwork, exacting proportion, and visual dramatic effects.



TAY BAK CHIANG (b. 1973) finds inspiration in the natural environment of Singapore and Southeast Asia; his subjects have included heliconia, lotus ponds and rocks, reinterpreted in terms of form, composition, technique, material and colour. These subjects, to his mind, are sentient beings that feel and perceive the world around them. 








